Partial Reopening of Schools

As you may be aware Minister Chris Hipkins has announced an indicative date of 15 November for the return of year 1 - 8 students in Alert Level Three zones.

We thought that some of you might be wondering how this might affect you and your whānau and Oaklynn - so thought an update on this would be helpful.

The Minister has instructed the Ministry of Education to work with the sector to come up with options for what this will look like. Auckland School Principals - including those from Specialist Schools like Oaklynn are shaping the 'return to school' advice.

We know this will be great news to some and cause others angst and concern.

At Oaklynn we welcome the announcement from the Minister and are looking forward to working alongside the Ministry of Education to develop a pathway for reopening in a safe manner that will meet the needs of our ākonga and whānau. **TO BE HONEST** - we have very little idea as to what that might look like yet. We do know it will take some time and some tight organisation.

There are factors that need to be considered:

- Our partial return to school will be highly dependent on the availability of our own staff.
- The majority of our staff are support staff with children their availability will depend on what the partial return looks like in their own children's schools.
- Health status of staff

What are we doing now?

At this point in time we are beginning to survey staff as to their current situation as we need clearer information on exactly how many of our staff have a) a health condition or b) primary aged children that they need to care for.

Next week we will:


- begin collecting some information from you about what your whānau needs or preferences are in terms of return to school. We imagine there might be some families who do not want to return their child / young person and others who do.
- Begin to make plans based on the information we have.

Level 3 onsite programme

The Ministry of Education has stated that schools may have a very small number of students attend an on-site programme if they don't have an appropriate carer at home.

Oaklynn has accepted a small number of students to return to school this week because either;

- Both parents / carers are essential workers and there is no appropriate care at home OR
- They are no longer able to keep their child or young person safe at home.

All staff interacting with learners or whanau will be vaccinated

The Board of Trustees has agreed unanimously, that in order to provide a safe environment for our staff and learners any staff having **face to face interaction with any learner or whānau** associated with our school **will have been doubly vaccinated**.

We believe this is the most proactive and preventative action we can take to keep our vulnerable learners safe.

This applies to:

- Supporting the onsite Level 3 programme
- If and when we return to school this term
- Any orthotics / physiotherapy clinics
- Any other activity where staff come into close contact with learners and their whanau

Staff will also have returned a negative test result prior to coming in to work or doing any of the above work for the first time.

of the health and disability system; testing, contact tracing and case management the new framework across all levels, and there may still be a need to use wider capacity; and the transmission of COVID-19 within the community, including its impact on key populations.

Factors for considering a shift between levels: vsccination coverage, capacity Localised lockdowns: will be used as part of the public health response in lockdowns (similar to the measures in Alert Level 3 or 4).

Vaccination certificates: Requiring vaccination certificates will be optional for many locations. There are some higher-risk settings where they will be a requirement in order to open to the public. Some places won't be able to introduce vaccination requirements, to ensure everyone can access basic services, including supermarkets and pharmacies.
