





Community update 08/03/2022

Kia ora e te whānau

We are aware that Covid-19 numbers are increasing within our local community. In order to be more responsive to this situation, we are designing a system (which we will share with you) that will more readily communicate any cases connected with the school, and the location of these cases within our settings at Base and across our satellites. This will take the place of letters going out, which is how we have communicated to you (via email) previously.

Regrettably, we now have transmission within the school, as our community becomes exposed to more cases. Please be extra careful and vigilant of any symptoms which may be related to the Omicron virus. We are in the unfortunate position, where any symptoms are now more likely to be Covid-19 related. You will be called if your young person is unwell - it is vital that we work together to keep each other safe.

We are doing our best to keep the school staffed, safe and open. We really appreciate your help. Every day we are doing our best to staff our classrooms and units - which is becoming increasingly difficult and challenging. If we do make contact with you to pick up your young person, please understand that we are thinking of the wellbeing of your son/daughter as well as his/her classmates and staff.

All staff at Oaklynn, including the senior management team, are trying to be as flexible as possible to continue to accommodate and support our learners.

When can my child come back to school after isolating?

All household members (including the positive case) must isolate for 10 days. If another family member tests positive during this time your 10 days does NOT have to start again.

Your child can return to school once they have completed 10 days isolation and have been symptom free for 48 hours.

Please contact your child's teacher to let them know your child is returning . We are operating with significantly reduced staff and need to ensure we have the right people in the right places
